



## SUMMARY OF DIVERSITY DATA

St Ives Chambers is required by the Bar Standards Board to publish an anonymised summary of its diversity data in respect of all barristers and staff every three years.

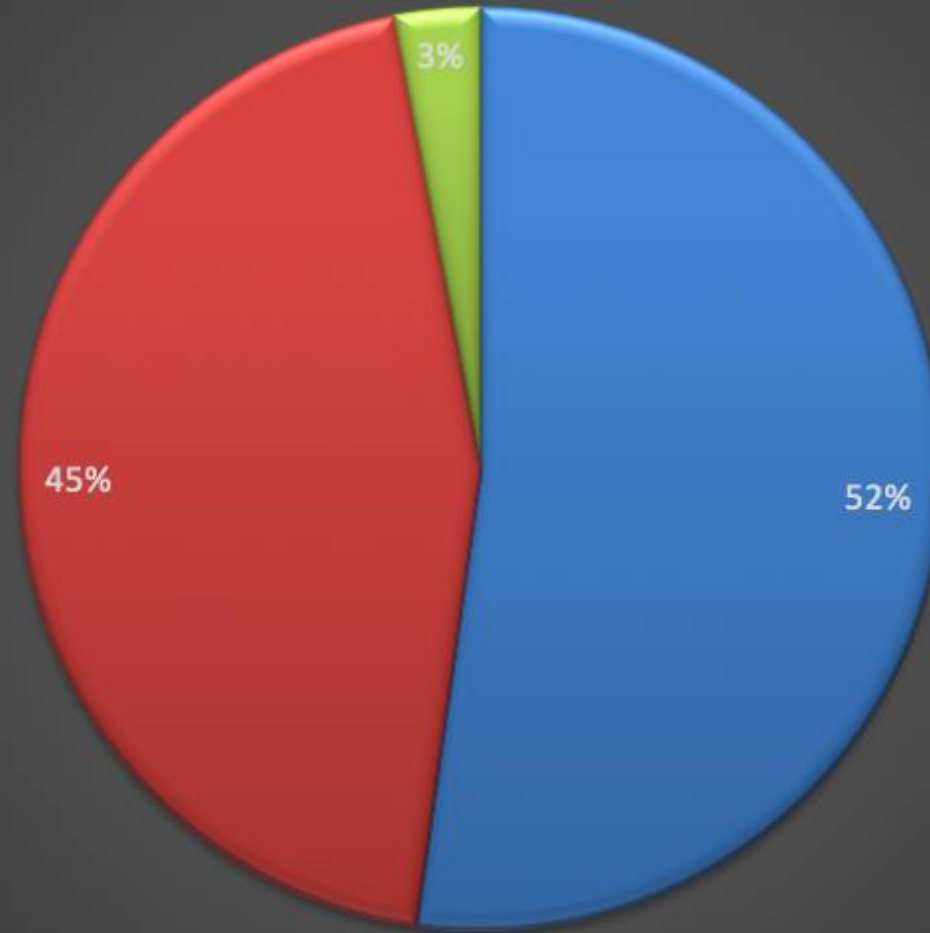
We have a total of 91 barristers (including QCs, Tenants, Door Tenants and Pupils) and 21 members of staff. For the purposes of this data collection exercise, the response rate for barristers was 74% and the response rate for staff was 90%.

In accordance with the Bar Standards Board's rules on diversity data collection, we have not included any data relating to the protected characteristics of sexual orientation and religion/belief as consent was not obtained from all barristers and staff. Furthermore, we have made every effort to categorise data so as not to lead to the identification of specific individuals.

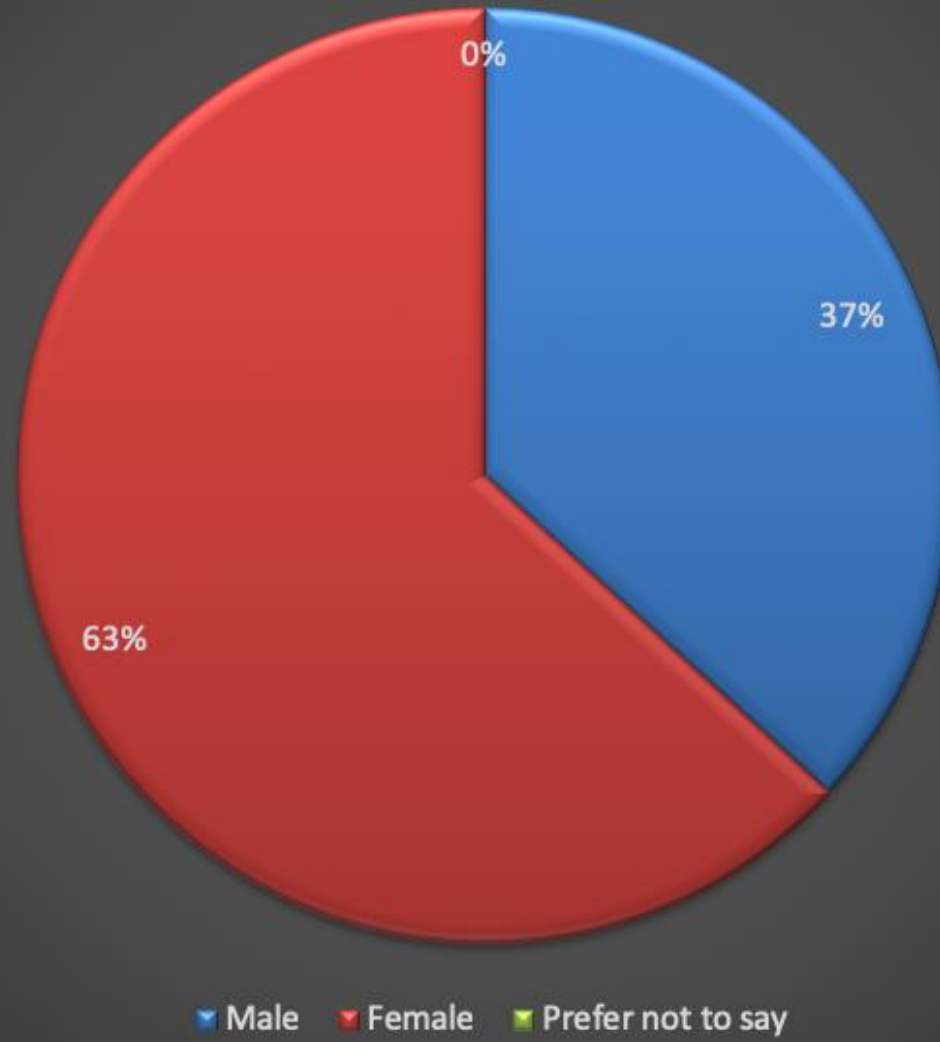

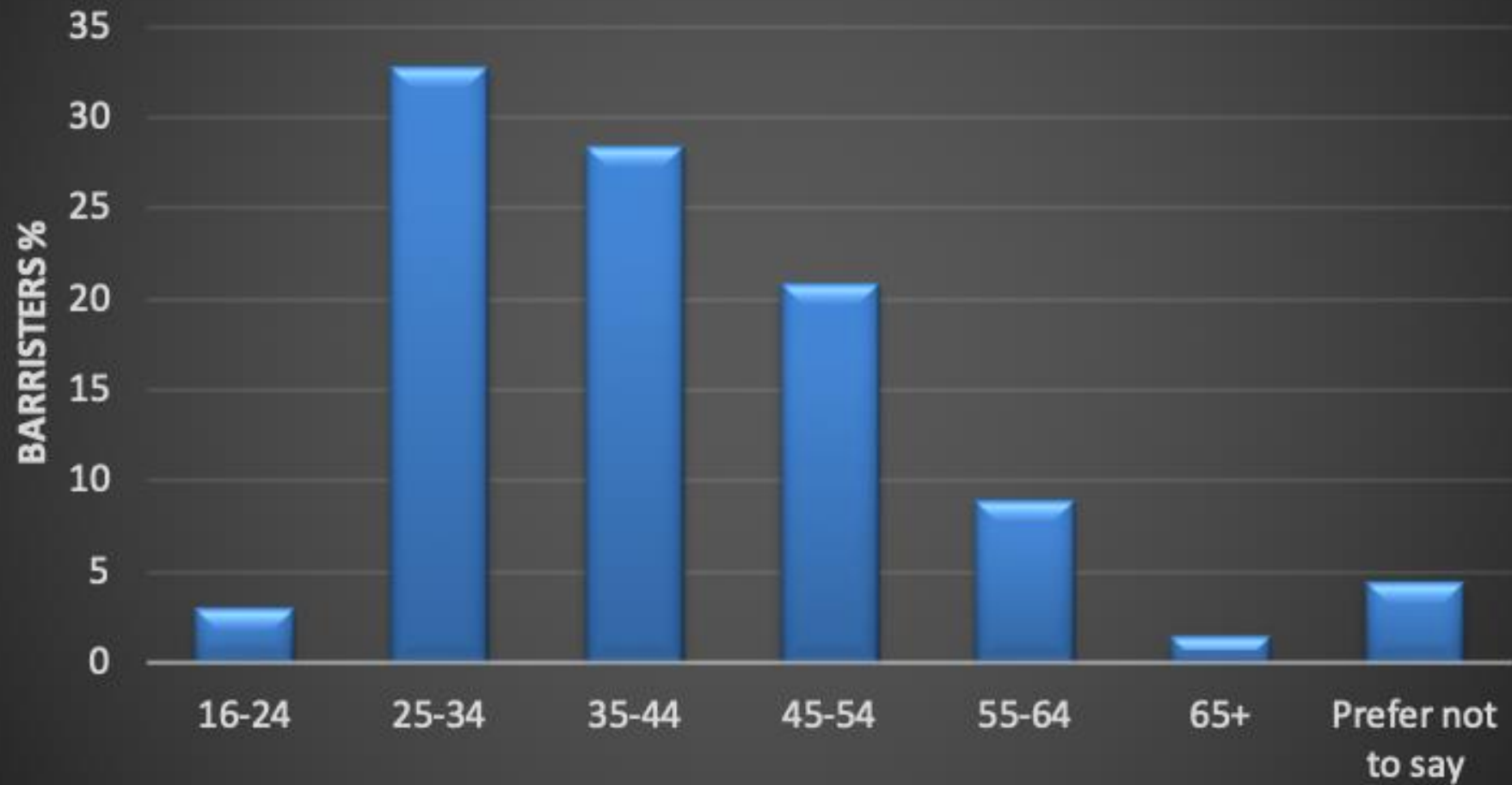

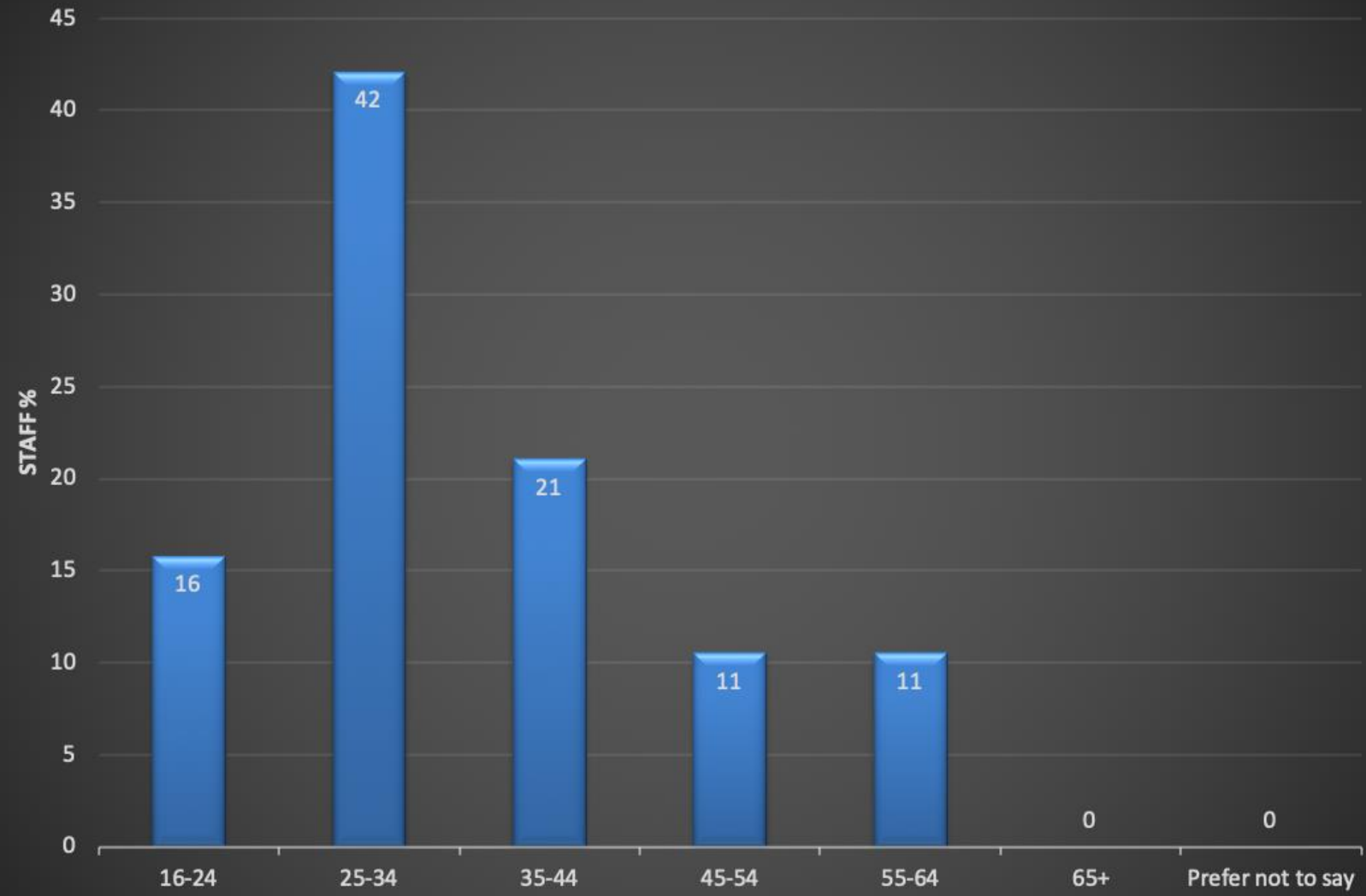

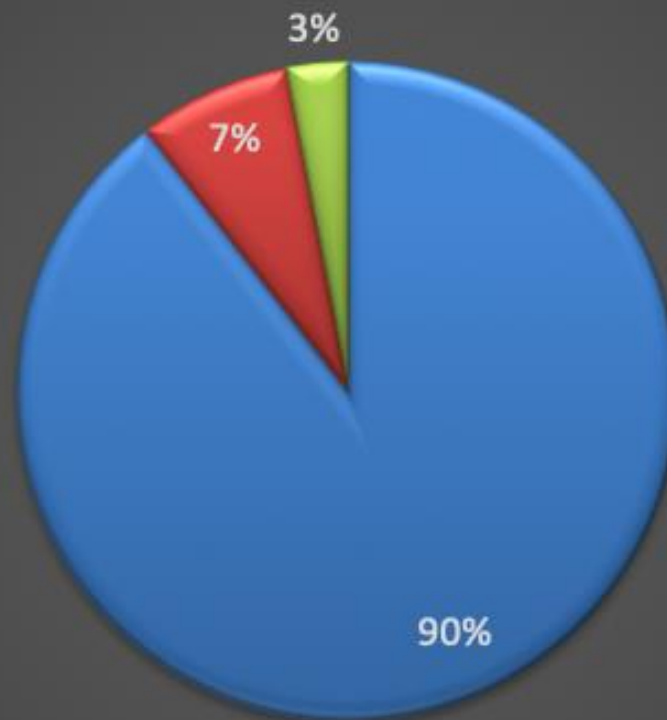

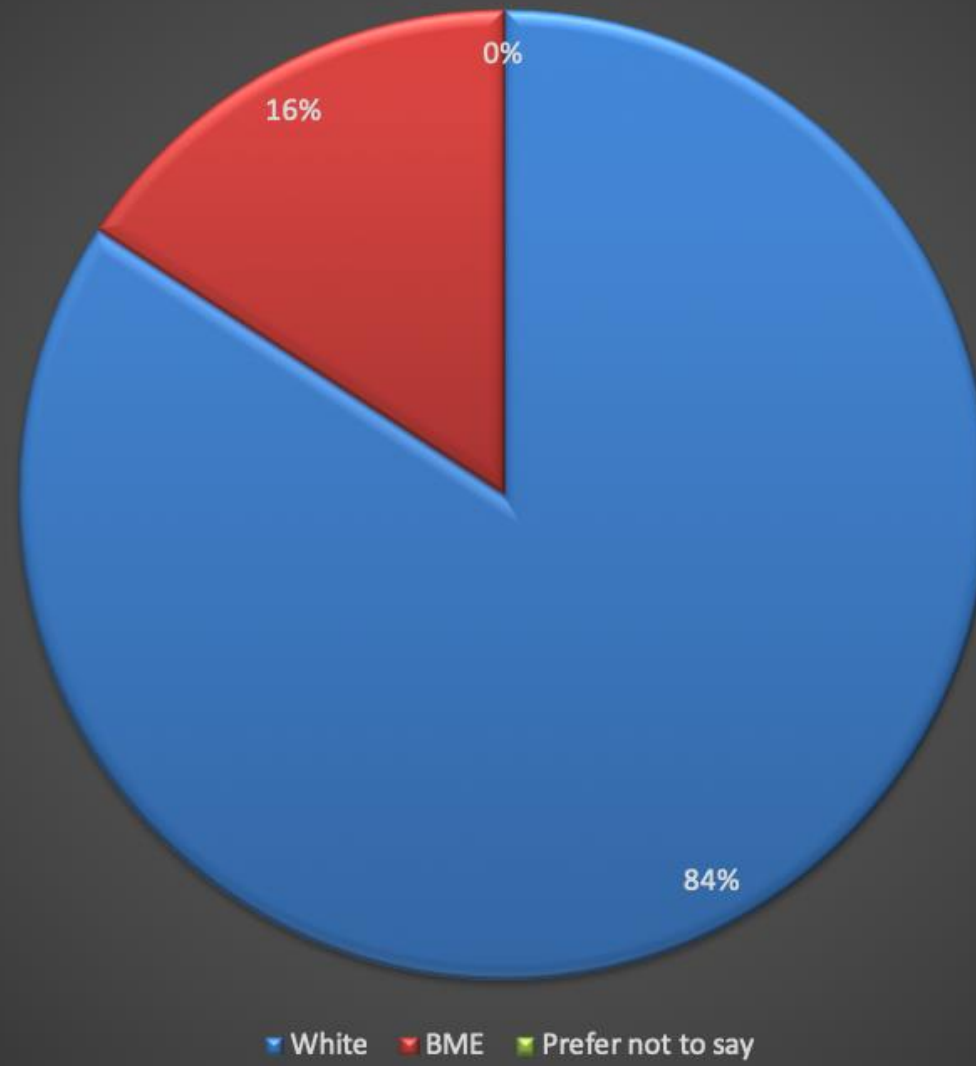

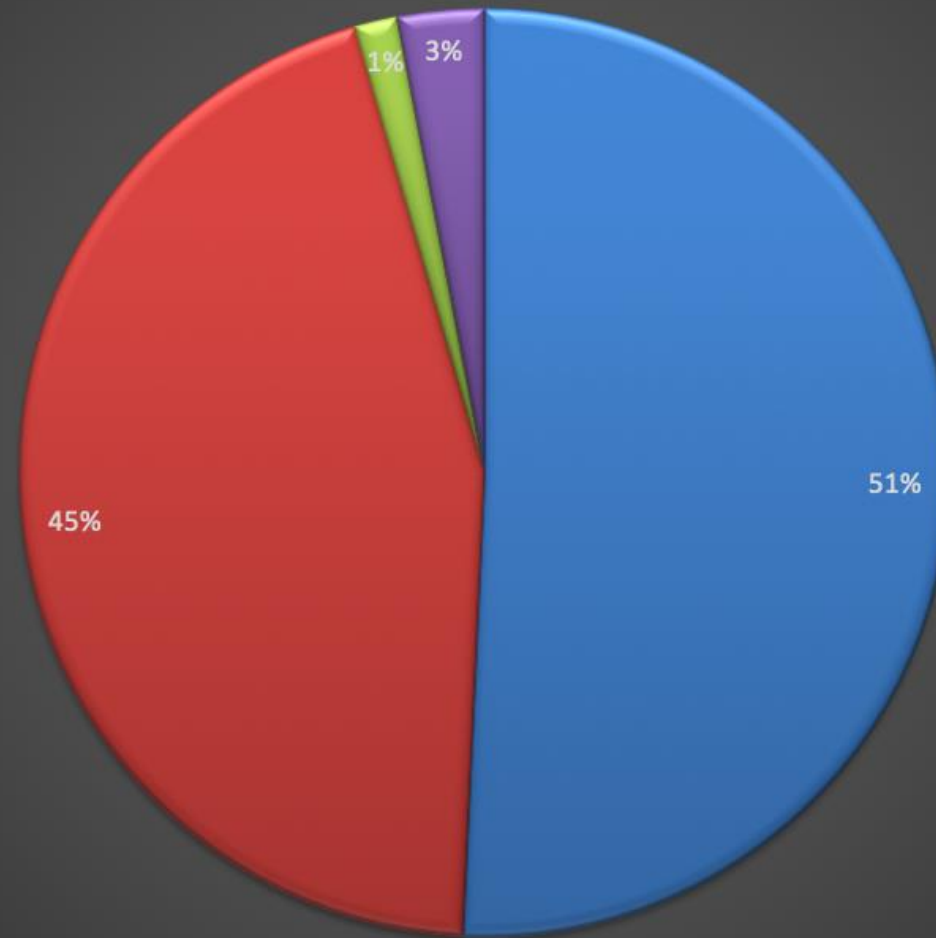

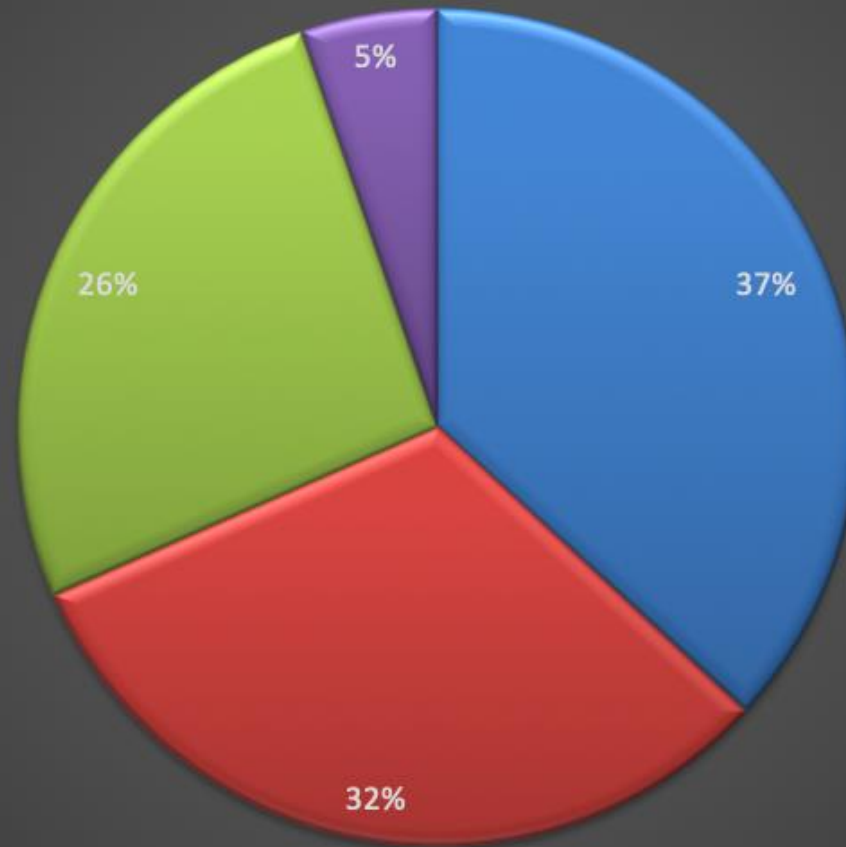
**Barristers: If you went to university, were you part of the first generation of your family to do so?**

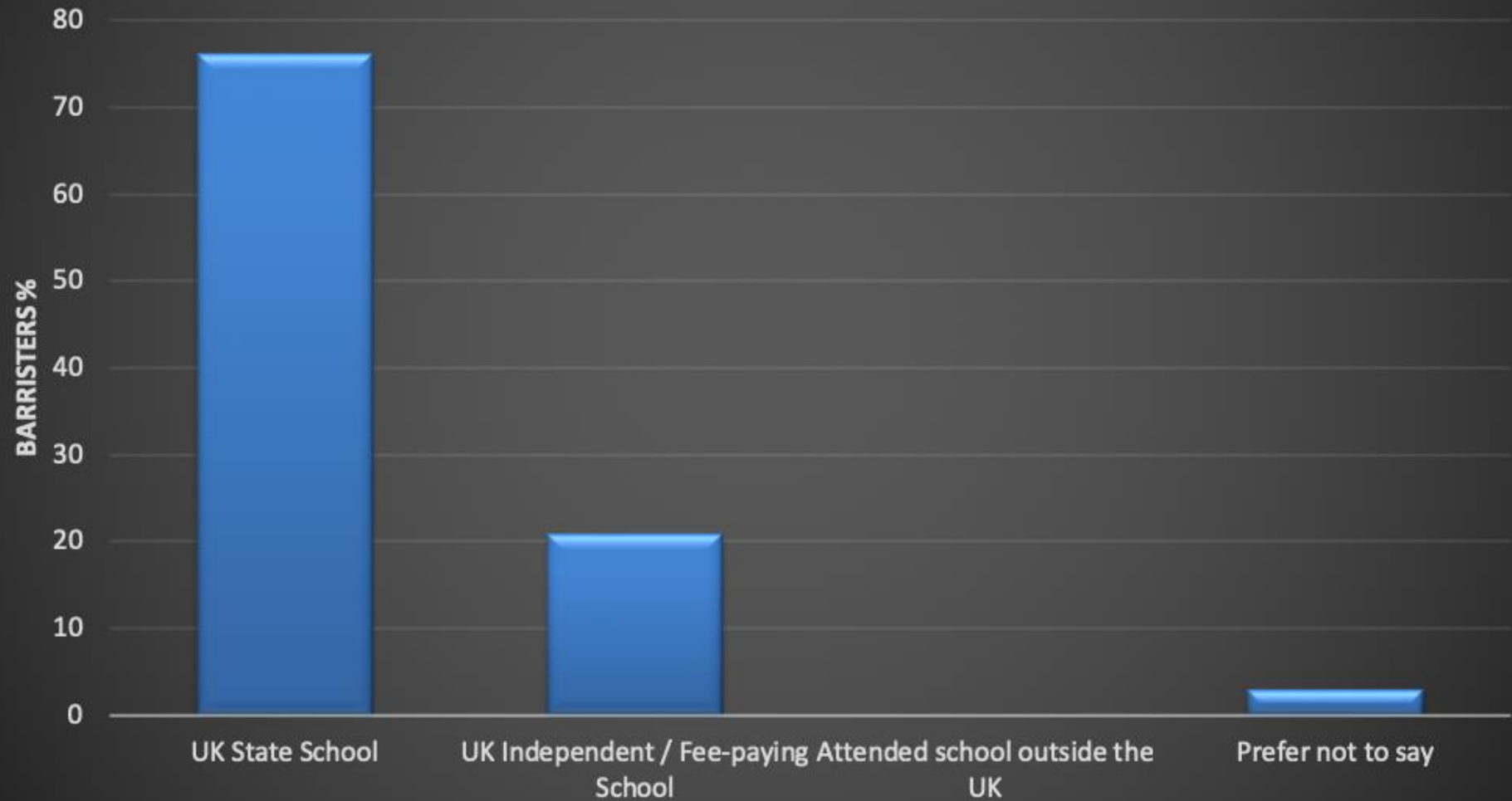

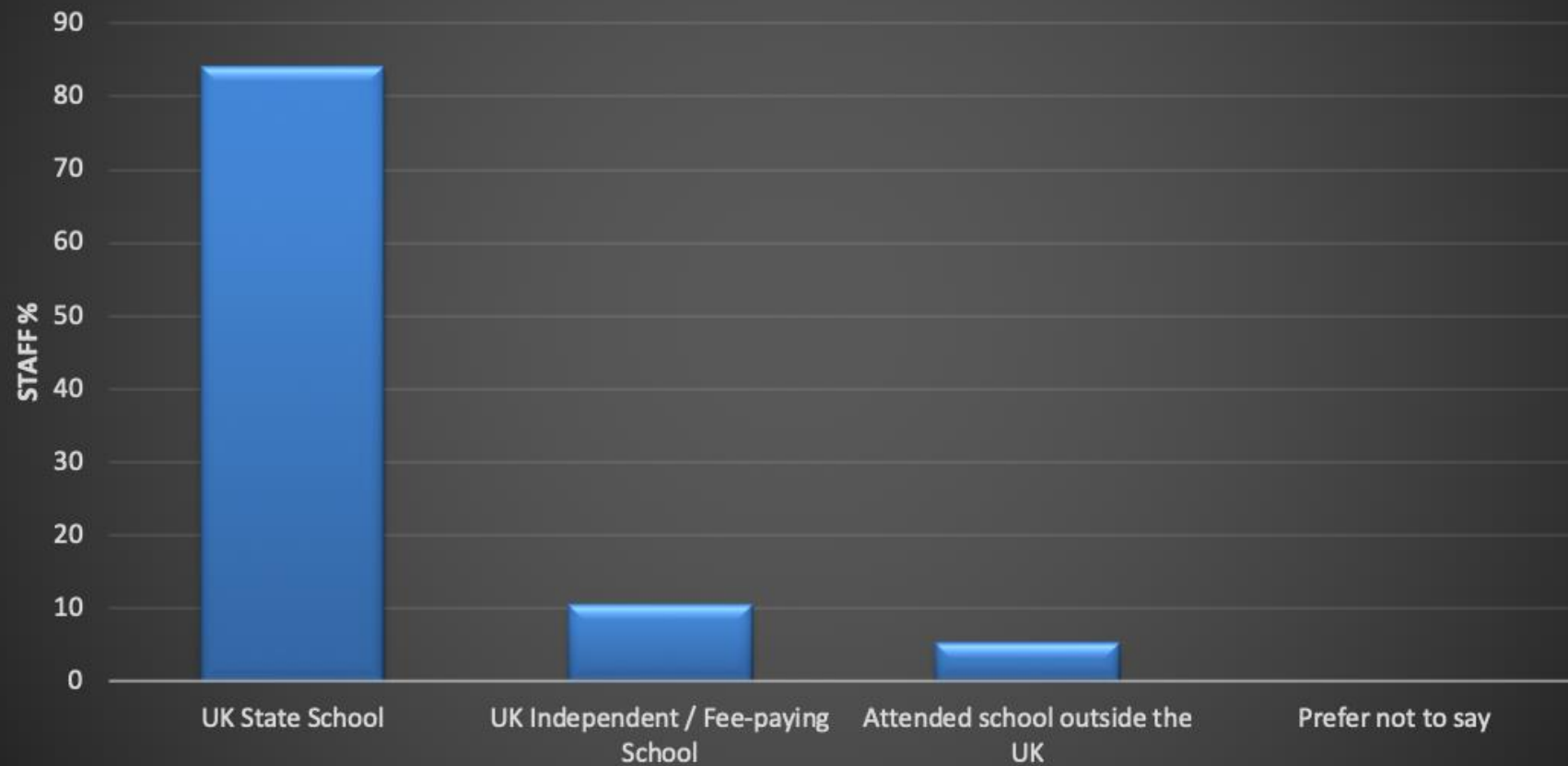

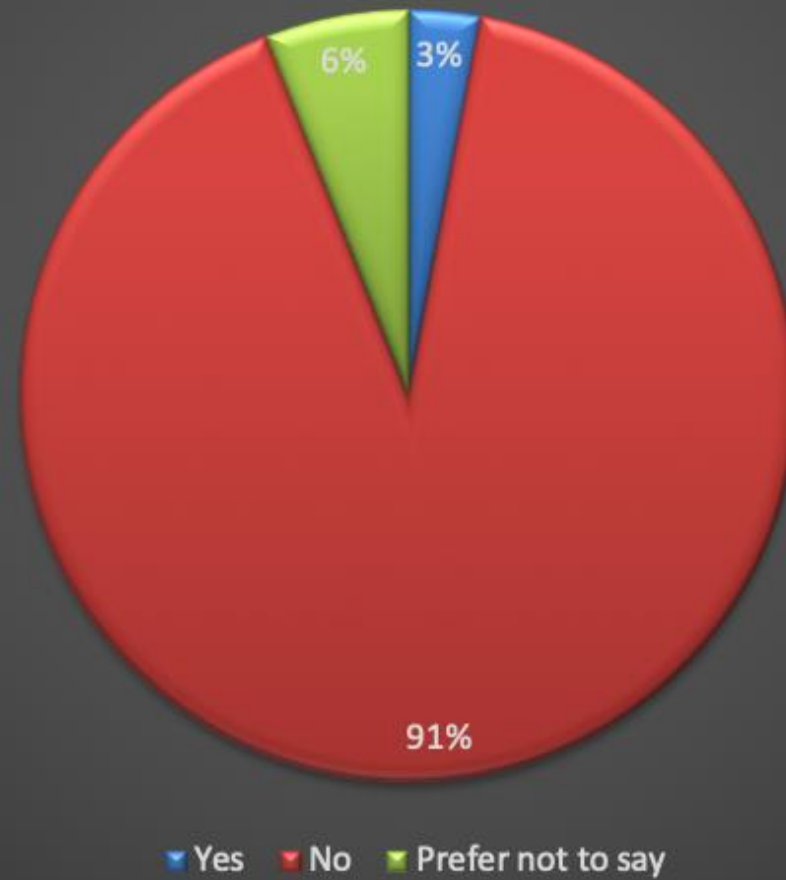
## Barristers: Did you mainly attend a state or fee paying school between the ages of 11 and 18?



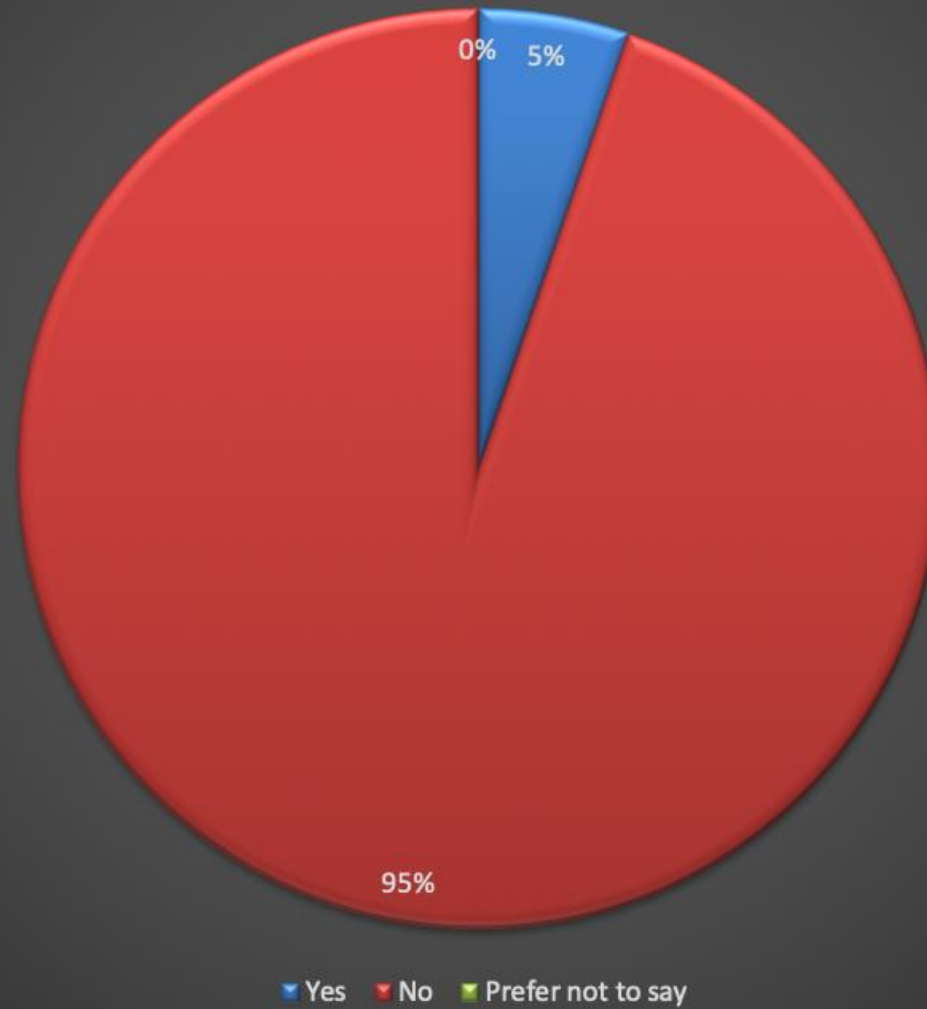

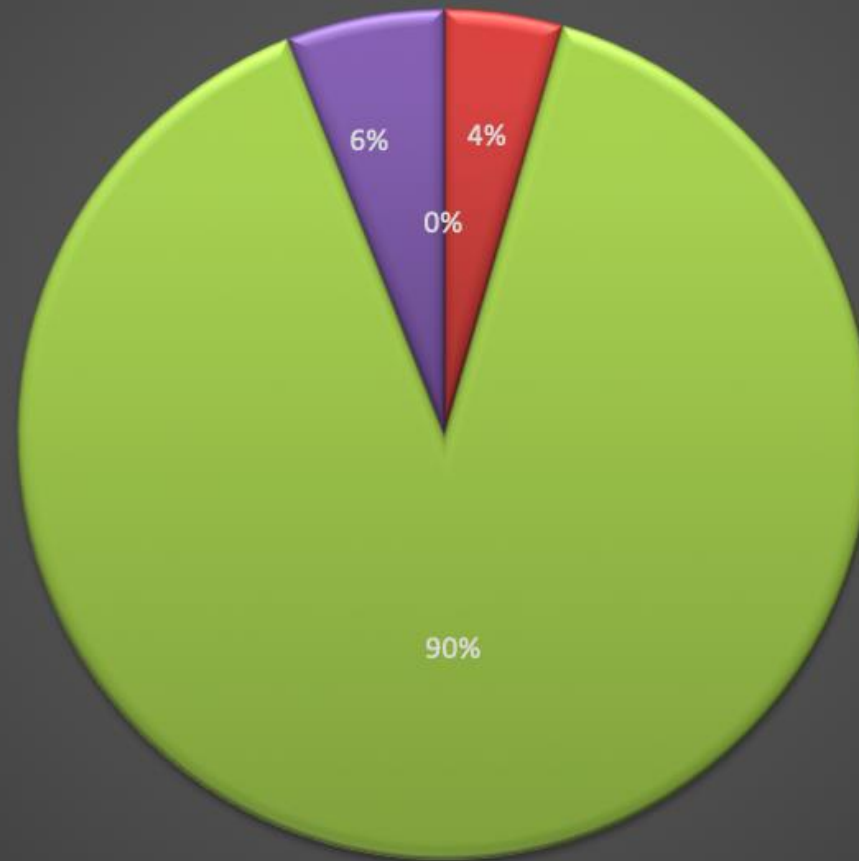
## Barristers: Do you consider yourself to have a disability according to the definition in the Equality Act?



**Staff: Do you consider yourself to have a disability according to the definition in the Equality Act?**

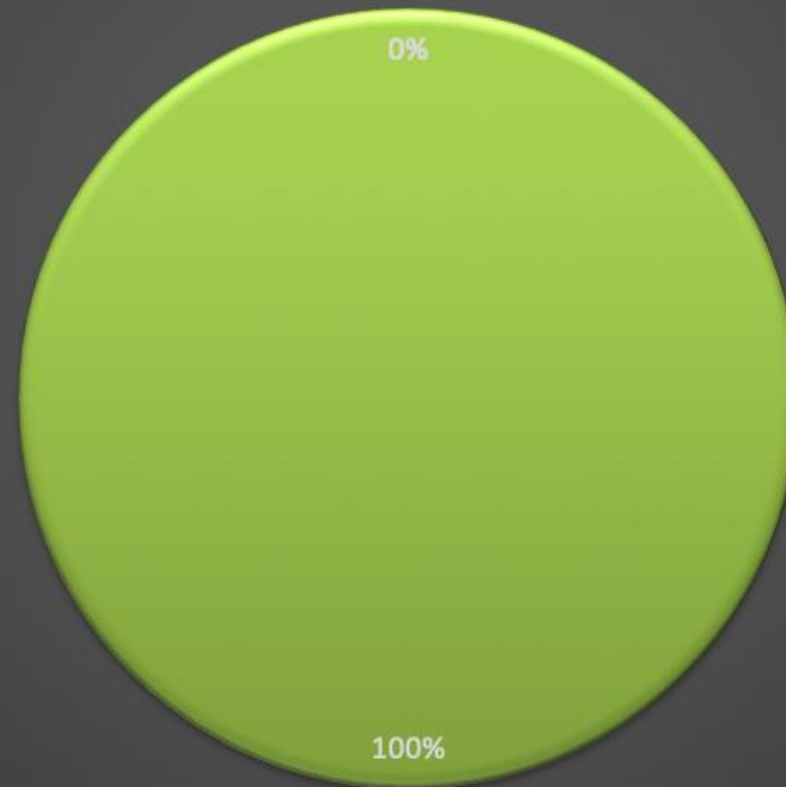


**Barristers: Are your day-to-day activities limited because of a health problem or disability which has lasted, or is expected to last, at least 12 months?**



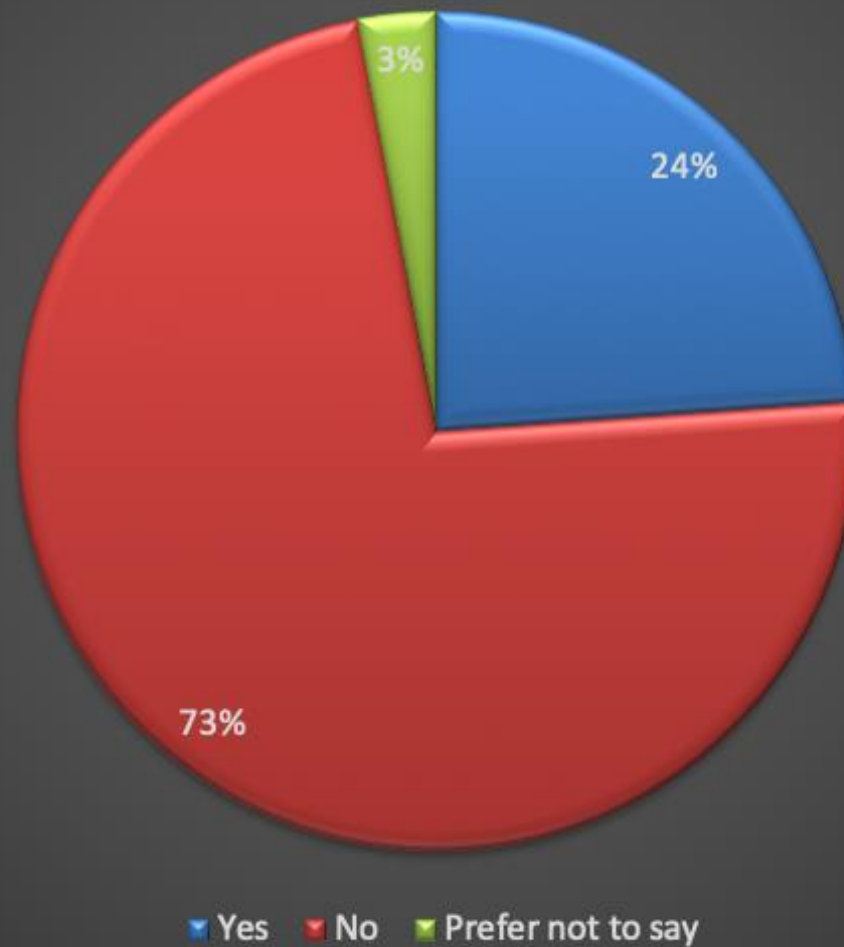

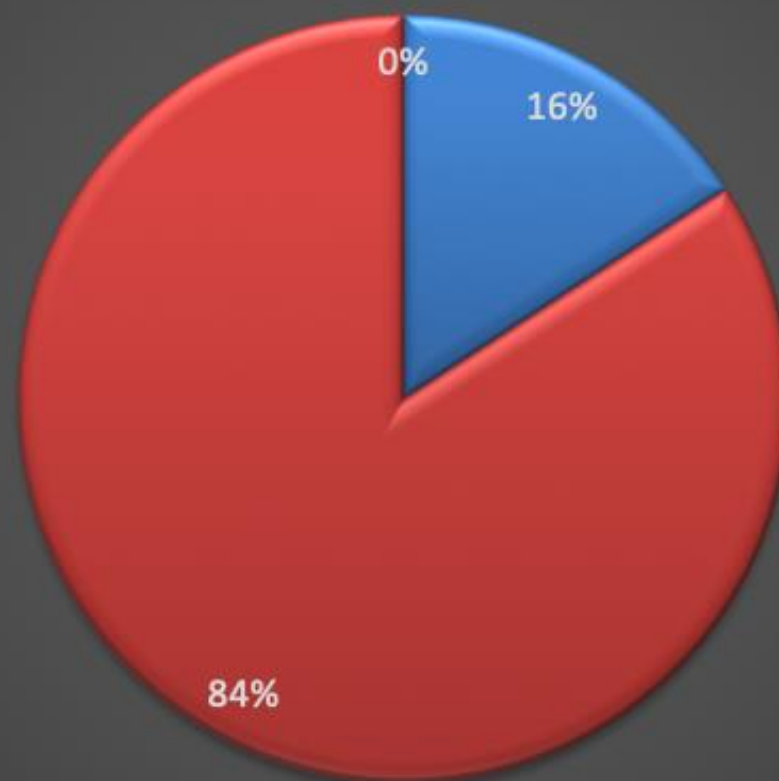

## Barristers: Are you a primary carer for a child or children under 18?



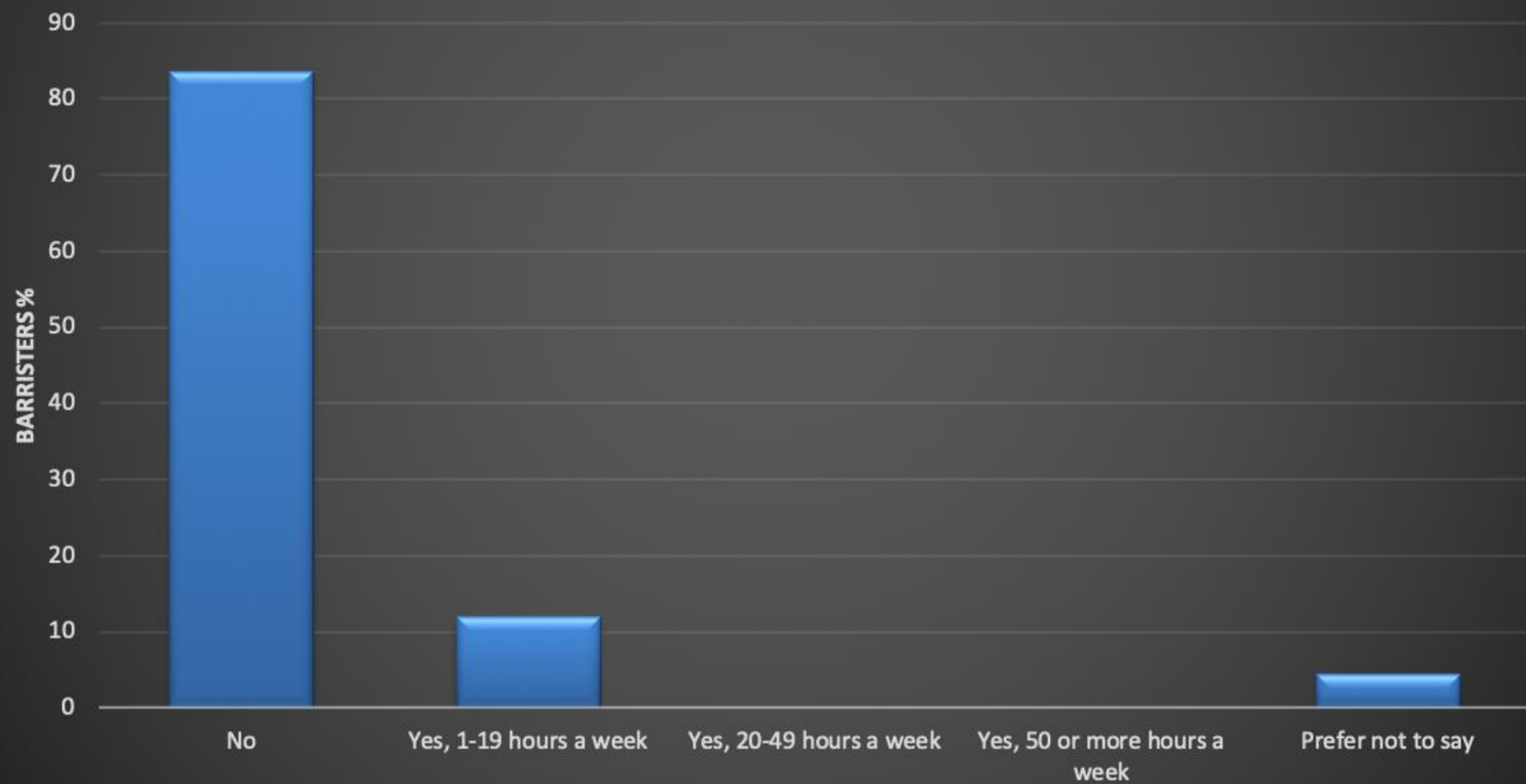
